Fueling Our Communities for a Brighter Future

In the first quarter of 2024, Virginia Natural Gas (VNG) announced a \$620,000 investment in workforce development across southeastern Virginia, focusing on our commitment to community growth and the future of the local workforce. The investment supports organizations recognized for impactful programs and innovative approaches to workforce development, with emphasis on young adults, veterans and students at Virginia Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU). This funding will allow seven specialized entities to enhance essential job readiness programs, including interview preparation, resume writing, networking and scholarships for technical training in high-demand industries, all critical for individual success in a rapidly evolving job market.

Through this grant, the **Hampton Roads Workforce Foundation** will fund their NextGen program to prepare youth and veterans for careers or further education. The **Virginia Chamber Foundation** will use the grant to support workforce programs, including veteran employment through hiring fairs and conferences. **Norfolk State University** will enhance job readiness through workshops, mentorship and hands-on training under their Spartan Promise to Persist with Purpose program. **Hampton University** will continue their workforce development scholarship for technical training in fields like welding and heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC).

This grant will allow **Bridging Communities Regional CTE Foundation** to prepare students for professional industries through career-focused education and work-based learning. **Neighborhood** will focus on personal and professional growth, providing technical training and employment connections in growing sectors. The **Accelerating Change Together Grant Program** will offer a collaborative grant to enhance workforce development, in partnership with BayPort Credit Union, Huntington Ingalls Industries and Ferguson Enterprises.

By fostering economic growth and improving quality of life, VNG is a leader in providing energy and community support, championing a skilled and resilient workforce for a thriving Virginia.

Community Impact Awards

Virginia Natural Gas was awarded the **Civic 50 Award** by Volunteer Hampton Roads for a second time for prioritizing volunteerism, civic engagement and making a positive impact on our community. The Civic 50 is a national initiative established by Points of Light that honors community-minded companies. The Civic 50 Hampton Roads program sets the standard for civic engagement and creates a roadmap for companies committed to using their time, talent and resources to serve others and improve their communities. Companies are selected based on four dimensions: investment of resources, integration across business functions, institutionalization through policies and systems, and impact measurement. VNG took first place in the medium-sized category.

Virginia Natural Gas received the Virginia
Department of Energy award for Local Distribution
Company of the Year for the sixth time. This
prestigious recognition from the Virginia Oil and
Gas Association recognizes VNG's outstanding
achievements in sustainability, infrastructure
investments and corporate philanthropy.

Virginia Natural Gas was also a recipient of the Hampton Roads **Top Workplaces Award** from Inside Business for going above and beyond to create a positive working environment for our employees by providing a motivational workplace that makes our employees' lives easier, allows time for fun and supports community involvement and work-life balance. This is the fourth time VNG has received this honor.











Children & Education

Celebrate Freedom Showcases Innovation and Career Opportunities for High School Students

Courtesy of a gift from Virginia Natural Gas Foundation, the **Celebrate Freedom Foundation (CFF)** brought its unique, STEM-centered showcase to three Virginia high schools: Hampton High School, Bethel High School and Heritage High School.

Alongside CFF's impressive fleet of military aircraft and advanced drone technology, Virginia Natural Gas was onsite demonstrating our own innovative tools and career opportunities to area students considering careers in energy. Participants had hands-on experiences with our Picarro leak detection vehicle, field service and locating technologies and the PRX live gas main inspection tool.

This event highlights our shared commitment to fostering a skilled workforce ready to meet the global challenges of the future. By offering hands-on experiences with cutting-edge technology, the CFF and Virginia Natural Gas continue to inspire students and enhance their understanding of opportunities in STEM. We reached approximately 1,500 kids and our job application site received over 600 visits in three days! We look forward to seeing how these experiences will shape their professional journeys.



Community Enrichment

Helping to Create Employment Opportunities to Empower Autism Community

In 2024, Virginia Natural Gas proudly supported **FACT's (Families of Autism Coming Together)** HERO (Helping Employees Reach Outcomes) program through a community enrichment grant, helping to address a critical need in Hampton Roads. The HERO program is dedicated to creating job opportunities for youth and young adults with autism, providing them with the skills, education and hands-on training needed for long-term employment success. With a focus on building an inclusive workforce environment, HERO equips participants with essential job skills such as customer service, time and financial management.

Unemployment remains a significant challenge for individuals with autism, with national studies showing more than 66% of young adults with autism are unemployed and not enrolled in higher education after high school. FACT's HERO program aims to bridge this gap by offering a supportive work environment where participants can develop crucial skills and gain the confidence needed for future independence and success in integrated job settings.

The funding from Virginia Natural Gas will allow FACT to create more job opportunities and improve training for HERO participants, helping them gain valuable work experience, become role models in the autism community and prepare for future careers. VNG's support is reducing employment barriers for individuals with autism, promoting a more inclusive workforce in Hampton Roads.











Military & Veterans

VNG Partners with the Tuskegee Airmen Tidewater Chapter for Black History Month

Virginia Natural Gas' chapter of EnRapport, an employee resource group, partnered with the **Tuskegee Airmen Tidewater Chapter** for Black History Month in February.

VNG employees learned about the special role local airmen played in World War II through a panel discussion with some of the original airmen. The Tidewater Chapter's core values include excellence, honesty, integrity, respect, accountability and a commitment to serving youth.

The Tuskegee Airmen were the first African American military airmen in the United States, serving in the U.S. Army Air Forces during World War II. They were trained at Tuskegee University located near Tuskegee, Alabama, which was chosen for its airfield, civilian pilot training program and flight aptitude exam results. The Tuskegee Airmen served as bomber escorts, navigators, mechanics, instructors, nurses, cooks and in other support personnel roles. Their success helped pave the way for the desegregation of the U.S. military after World War II.

The Tuskegee Airmen Tidewater Chapter received a \$5,000 charitable donation from the Virginia Natural Gas Foundation to support their social justice initiatives. They are currently furthering their legacy through scholarships, school visits and a commitment to upholding the history and future of African American airmen.

Environmental Stewardship

Helping Our Region's Sustainability Efforts

The Virginia Natural Gas Foundation once again partnered with **The Elizabeth River Project** for the second year of their Ryan Resilience Series. The first year was a success, with high attendance from diverse audiences thanks to the unique approach of connecting art and science to address climate change and resilience from a community perspective. This series aims to boost environmental stewardship and community sustainability by bringing people together to explore climate and environmental issues across the region.

The Elizabeth River Project leads efforts to restore the health of the Elizabeth River. Through the Ryan Resilience Series, they make important topics like sea level rise, climate change and environmental stewardship more accessible by providing educational opportunities through various lenses, including art, science, restoration, culture and history. The series also creates opportunities for those who have not historically had access to the water, fostering relationships of care between the people of the river and its plants, animals and data.

Through our charitable donation, VNG will help support thought-provoking programs in art, history and science that help establish the Ryan Resilience Lab as a hub for environmental justice and community sustainability, underscoring our Foundation's commitment to environmental sustainability. We look forward to an engaging lineup of events and activities throughout 2025.











Our Employees in the Community

Polar Plunge

Since 1999, VNG employees have eagerly braved the icy waters of the Atlantic Ocean to raise funds for Special Olympics athletes of Virginia Beach through the Polar Plunge campaign. Our longstanding partnership with Special Olympics Virginia has seen Virginia Natural Gas and our dedicated employees donate over \$600,000 to support training, competitions, leadership opportunities and health services for our local athletes. Additionally, our employees have volunteered their time, and talents, to assist with Polar Plunge activities throughout the years.

VNG committed to "Turning Up the Heat" and "Going for the Cold" at the Virginia Beach Oceanfront for the Polar Plunge in 2024, raising over \$37,000 in donations – in addition to a \$15,000 corporate donation. VNG contributed over 200 volunteer hours to set up for the fundraiser, assist Special Olympics staff with event details on the day of the Plunge and clean up afterward. Together, we are making a significant impact in our community, supporting our athletes, and fostering a spirit of unity and generosity.

Energy to Serve

One of our main volunteer events each year is our spring 'Energy to Serve' campaign. During this year's campaign, we were back in action with nearly 50 VNG employees providing over 118 volunteer hours to support the following Hampton Roads nonprofits, schools and other charitable organizations:






Energy to Give

A Year at the Virginia Chamber of Commerce


Over the past year, Duvall's leadership has significantly contributed to workforce initiatives. His participation in events and partnerships aligned workforce strategies with Virginia's industries. Notably, the TEAM VIRGINIA partnership with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership (VEDP) addressed the skills gap by aligning training programs with job market demands. Duvall facilitated dialogue between employers and educational providers, preparing the workforce for a changing economy.

At the Virginia Health Care Conference, he addressed the need for a skilled healthcare workforce by advocating for targeted training and partnerships to support the industry's growth and patient outcomes.

In the infrastructure sector, Duvall emphasized the need for skilled workers in construction, engineering and technology at the Virginia Forum on Infrastructure. His advocacy for public-private collaboration promotes training initiatives that meet infrastructure needs, improving quality of life in Virginia.

While attending the Virginia Education & Workforce Conference, he highlighted the importance of aligning K-12 and higher education with workforce needs. By advocating for innovative educational programs, Duvall continues to advocate for a new generation of skilled workers.

Robert Duvall's dedication to workforce development has not only strengthened Virginia's talent pipelines but also fostered a collaborative environment that aligns education and industry needs, ensuring a prosperous future for the Commonwealth.
